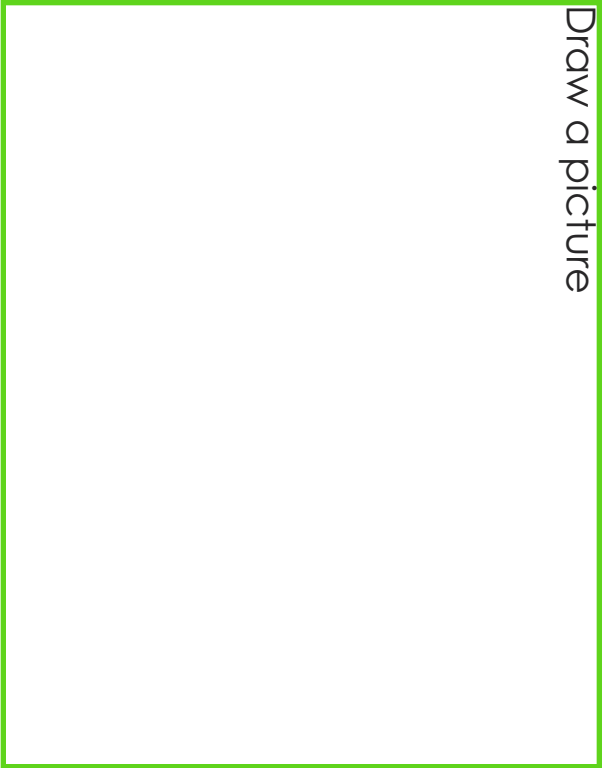

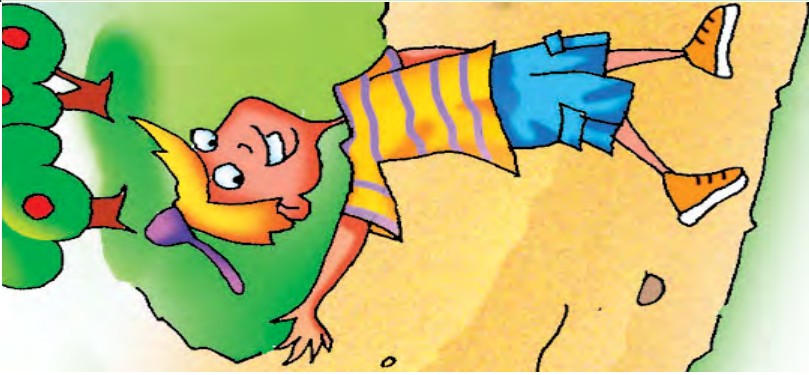

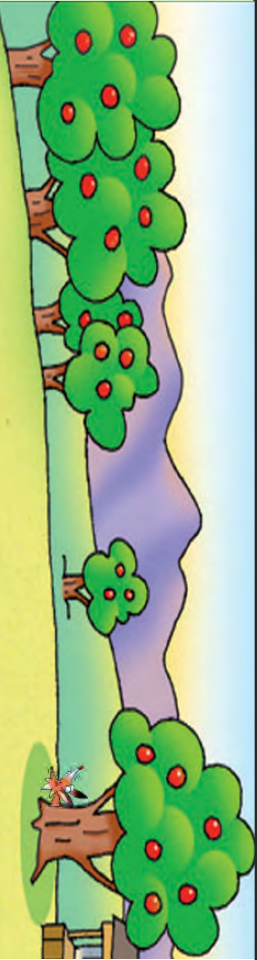
That little boy learned an important lesson that day. Once you start to trick people and tell lies, no one will ever believe you. Even if you are telling the truth.

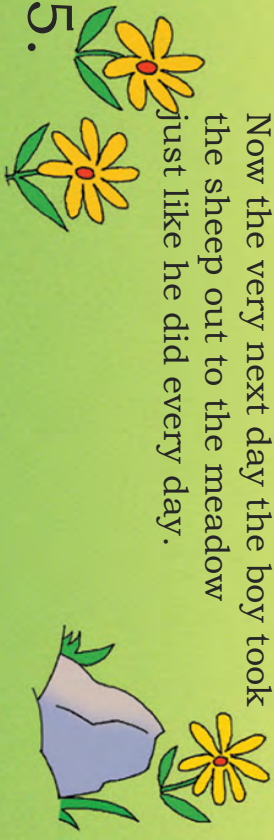
"Wolf, wolf" cried the frightened little boy, but no one came to help. Just then the wolf jumped out and onto one of the sheep and dragged it back into the forest.



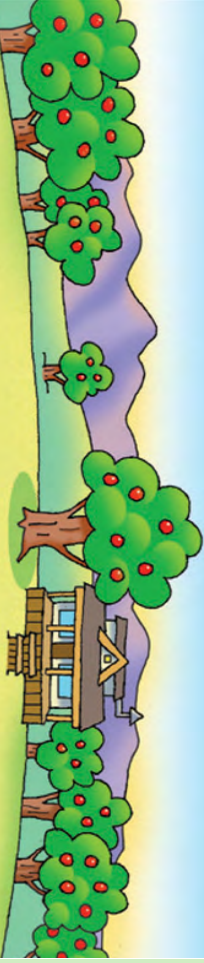

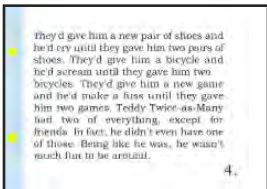
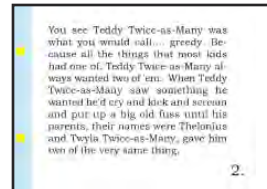
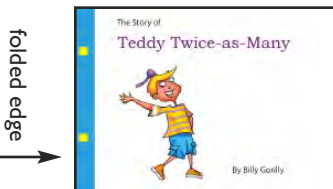
1 Print the pages for the book



2 Fold each page in half as shown



3 Fold each page in half again as shown

Open the folded book pages as shown.

Take # 2 pages and set on top of pages # 1. Take # 3 pages, set on top of # 2

Both of his parents, Theonius and Teyla Twice-as-Many, thought this was all fine and good. Because it seemed to make Teddy Twice-as-Many twice as happy. But they were making him a spoiled little boy and he was never really happy.

They'd give him an ice cream cone and he'd stomp his feet until they gave him two ice cream cones.

They'd give him a new pair of shoes and he'd try until they gave him two pairs of shoes. They'd give him a bicycle and he'd scream until they gave him two bicycles. 5 Fold all pages in half again.

6 You can secure the books in several ways.

- punch holes on yellow squares and secure with ribbon as shown left. I used 1/4-inch grosgrain ribbon with a rectangle hole punch.
- use double-sided tape down center of pages
- Staple near yellow squares **Note:** Staples can be choking hazard for small children. Not recommended for children ages 4 and under.
